
Show and Tell:

Judi showed a comparison of rocks from Arizona, Utah and New Mexico. She also had a couple of pictures of Arizona Petrified Forest logs.



- ✓ **Show Information** We are confirmed with 14 inside dealers and 4 outside. Mike will be putting out the signs the week of the show. The bright green flyers have been purchased in both quarter sheet and 81/2 x 11 sheets. The ads started in the Nickel and Giant Nickel this week. The week of the show they will be a larger section with a coupon for \$1.00 of on admission. Mike also contacts all free online publications and community calendars in the area. On Tuesday, May 9th at 8:30 Janet and Margaret will be appearing on the community show at Nookies put on by KOHU.
- ✓ Janet, Margaret, Jamie Armentrout and Tonya will be working together to create gem trees to use as a special door prize for the Mothers on Mother's Day.
- ✓ Judi reported on the sign ups so far for cases, potluck and working. She will call members and complete the list. She spoke with a number of people at the Lakeside show about demonstrating. There are possibilities of wire wrapping, gem tree creation, knapping, gold panning, faceting and perhaps sphere creation. Judi will follow up on these.
- ✓ George Last will most likely bring the Ice Age Floods and BMCC will be putting up a display soliciting for their Geology class.
- ✓ The silent auction table will again have consignment items which will carry a 70-30% split.

 (We will also plan to have some long term auction items, so if you have something you would like to put on this higher end auction.)
- ✓ On Sunday members may purchase a sale table for \$20. They will be considered dealers and can sell all rock related items.
- ✓ We will have roast beef and rolls as the main dish for our potluck. We usually plan for around 60-70 people. We have extended an invitation to the Lakeside Club. The potluck is for all the members and the dealers. It is scheduled for 5:30 on Friday, the 12th.
- ✓ Miscellaneous The fee for the picnic in August is paid and the West Park at McNary is reserved.
- ✓ We want to give Elmer and others who have so graciously donated door prizes a huge thank you. It is fun being able to give out more than one prize and especially nice when it goes to a new member or guest. Thanks again for your generosity.
- ✓ The Executive Committee made the decision to continue membership in ALAA (American Lands Access Association). We completed the renewal form and Margaret will send the requisite \$50.

SET UP and TAKE DOWN

We start set up on <u>THURSDAY afternoon</u>. Go to the storage unit (A1 Storage on Joy Lane-Unit C7) and get all the items needed for the show-this includes cases, rocks, display items, signs, etc. We generally have rented tables from the fairgrounds so some muscled individuals will need to go pick them up. Pickups are necessary for these jobs, as you can see. Set up as much of the show as possible Thursday evening. (We generally buy some pizza or sub sandwiches for those who stick around and help with the process.)

FRIDAY meet at the Conference Center around 9:00 am.

We allow dealers and displayers to start their set up at noon, so we need to have all the basics in place by then. <u>SATURDAY</u> kicks off the show at 10:00 am, so if you are working at admissions, silent auction of the kids' corner, plan to be at the Conference Center no later than 9:45 am.

Saturday and Sunday all hands on deck to work at the kids' corner, admissions and silent auction.

We also need to tear down the show and return all the items to the storage unit after the show closes at 4:00 pm on Sunday.

<u>SUNDAY</u> as soon as the show closes, begin to neatly put away silent auction, Oregon rock display, Kids' corner items, admissions, etc. Display cases can be opened to remove your items at this time. (Remember, you are responsible for what you have put in your display case.) We need to be cognizant of the Dealers trying to pack up their wares and not become too "pushy" or anxious about their process. We can work on putting away tables, liners and other items while we wait for them to finish. We do not save the plastic covers on the dealer or display tables. We do save the blue ruffled skirting that covers the fronts. If you have a question, those who have taken part in the process are glad to help with an answer. All items have to be removed from the Center and returned to the storage unit, or other location.
